Hall of Fame Awards -James W. Shirley and Bill Brookins

The Grand Canyon Historical Society and the National Park Service hereby give recognition to those individuals who have selflessly contributed to the betterment of the Grand Canyon community in years past. This fourteenth annual award names two individuals who have shown exemplary service to the Grand Canyon community. The recipients have made personal contributions of money, time, and/or work over a period of many years. Previous recipients of the award and current residents have recommended these honorees. The names of the recipients will be engraved on the permanent plaque housed in the Shrine of Ages.

One recipient is deceased and happily the other one is still with us. The awardees this year are William "Bill" Brookins and James W. Shirley (deceased). A short biography for each follows below.

Bill Brookins always finds time to help. Just name the project in the Grand Canyon community or Tusayan and

Bill is almost certain to be involved. Kolb Studio, Boy Scouts, Toys for Tots, and Rotary are among those that have benefited from his talents. Bill's woodworking skills are such that local charities and fundraisers have come to count on him to provide handcrafted furniture for their events. Bill bears a striking resemblance to Santa Claus and consequently he assumes the role of the Jolly Elf during the season for events and parties. His generosity with his time, and personal commitment to the community have earned him recognition as the embodiment of year-round Christmas spirit. Somehow Bill always seems to know who or what project needs help, and he appears on scene to offer his services. We have all benefited from his example.

James W. Shirley served as manager of Babbitt's General Store for many years. As was the case in small towns, the store became the daily meeting place and Jim presided over the discussions, which gave him good insight into the needs of the community and its residents. His intimate knowledge of the people and his natural leadership led to initiation of many projects and to his getting help to those who needed it most. When he was unable to acquire ethnic food for some of his customers, he worked with the ladies of the Legion Auxiliary to provide cooking classes using American recipes. Jim always found time to work with the Boy Scouts and, although never a member, he participated in the many projects initiated by the American Legion's John Ivens Post. All who knew him said that Jim's efforts made the Grand Canyon community a better place.

Pioneer Award - John Azar

The Grand Canyon Historical Society's 2011 Pioneer Award was awarded in absentia to John Azar on July 16, 2011:

*For his efforts to preserve Grand Canyon's historic cabins. Since 1993, John has steadily devoted hundreds of hours to the preservation of historic Grand Canyon cabins. As an architect and master carpenter, John has donated his expertise in both areas in exchange for knowing these timeless, historic structures will remain for posterity. Not only has he done it without fanfare or praise, he frequently tackles these remote, isolated projects alone;

*For his education and outreach work. John routinely leads volunteer and youth groups who work on his preservation projects. He also shares his work through field visits and presentations. On all of these occasions, John imparts his knowledge and appreciation of Grand Canyon history, and helps instill a sense of stewardship for historic resources;

*For his recent work at Pasture Wash Ranger Station, where John combined his dedication with his outreach skills. There, John worked closely with Grand Canyon Youth and the NPS to preserve a deteriorated cabin on

the verge of demolition;

*For his contributions to the knowledge of Grand Canyon history through his original research, and writing;

*For his original contributions to the Grand Canyon Historical Society's History Symposiums, as well as his service as a volunteer at each symposium; and

*For his contributions and achievements as a member of the Grand Canyon Historical Society, including his service as a Board Member and Officer, his leadership on many service projects, and his ongoing work as Outings Coordinator to organize and lead Society outings.

Tom Myers provided the award committee with this anecdote to illustrate John's dedication:

Most recently, he worked on the initial phases of restoring the Pasture Wash Ranger Station. Last summer, I witnessed John's efforts first-hand when my son and I joined him as well as Jacob Fillion, and kids from Grand Canyon Youth, in assisting with the project. John assigned us duties while he quietly and diligently worked on the more technical and tedious repairs to shore-up the structure. John also supplied the tools—his own—as well as quite a bit of building material from his home in Fredonia. But what impressed me most was what I saw after coming back from a day hike the next afternoon. It was hours after the GCY folks had packed up and headed back to the Village. A monsoon storm had blown in, but there was John, all

alone but still working in the silent drizzle. It was a rather forlorn scene with the dilapidated cabin, but he cheerfully said he would be there plugging away for a couple more days before buttoning things up. It was an obvious "labor of love."
