Hall of Fame Awards Dr. Thomas Myers & Carl H. Guthrie

The 18th Hall of Fame Awards were presented at the Society's Annual Picnic at Shoshone point on July 11, 2015.

The Grand Canyon Historical Society and the National Park Service hereby give recognition to those individuals who have selflessly contributed to the betterment of the Grand Canyon community in years past. This eighteenth annual award names two individuals who have shown exemplary service to the Grand Canyon community. The recipients have made personal contributions of money, time, and/or work over a period of many years. Previous recipients of the award and current residents have recommended these honorees. The names of the recipients will be engraved on the permanent plaque housed in the Shrine of Ages. This year we honor one deceased, and one who continues in service to the community.


A short bio on each follows below:

Dr. Tom Myers has served the Grand Canyon community and region for many years as physician, educator and author. When not dealing with illness and injury at the Clinic, Tom has dedicated his time and efforts to educating a wide variety of residents, visitors and guides to the nuances of living below the rim and emergency first aid. Students at the Grand Canvon school, National Park Service first responders, Boy and Girl Scouts, Grand Canyon Association Field Institute, Phantom Ranch, Colorado River boatmen, and a number of other groups have all benefited from his classes. Not satisfied with just providing classes, he also founded the Desert Medicine Institute that provides training and certification of guides as Wilderness First Responders. Somewhere in between all of this. Tom has also managed to serve the community as a member of the Lions Club and Rotary, and support the Grand Canyon Foundation, Grand Canyon Music Festival, Special Olympics, Walk for Cancer, and the Grand Canyon Historical Society. His books and publications cover Grand Canyon history in a very special way that only his decades of experience in and around the Canyon could provide. In addition to his well-known books. Tom has been published in Arizona Highways, National Geographic, and, of course, the Ol' Pioneer. In his inimitable style, Tom continues to serve the community.

Carl Guthrie came to the Grand Canyon School as principal in 1952. From that point on he made the Canyon his home and raised his family. By 1958, his service and dedication to the school and students was rewarded when the community elected him to serve as Superintendent, Grand Canyon Public Schools. His passions at the schools were music and sports, as he firmly believed that both enriched students' lives. Carl endeavored to involve the students in these pursuits at every opportunity and it didn't matter if they were particularly talented in those fields. He worked together with the American Legion Post to establish athletic fields, and the field house continues to carry his name. As a member of the Grand Canyon Rotary Club, Carl was always one of first to volunteer for their numerous projects. Education of children always remained his highest priority and this extended to the Boy and Girl Scouts, and the Legion's Boys and Girls State leadership and citizenship projects. If it benefited the students Carl was always available to lead the way and lend his assistance. The Grand Canyon community was certainly a better place in which to live as a result of his efforts during the years he and his family lived at the Canyon. Submitted by Al Richmond
