Summer Board Meeting – Summary of Minutes

On Sunday August 9, 2015, from 8:30am-3:30pm, the GCHS Board held a mid-year meeting in Flagstaff to address issues and begin the planning process for the 2016 History Symposium.

In order to save space, below is an edited summary of the meeting minutes.

In attendance: Wayne Ranney, Kathy Farretta, Tom Martin, Lee Albertson, Beth Hickey, Ellen Brennan, Steven Landis, Dave Mortenson; Karen Greig, Amy Horn, Carol Naille

Report from the Treasurer, A. Horn: Trend is up for scholarship award. Wayne suggests the scholarship money go in the savings account of the Organization. Dave motions and Carol seconds putting scholarship funds in the empty savings account and this account will reflect the amount in the scholarship fund only. Motion caries. Karen moves and Steve seconds acceptance of the treasurer's report.

Report from the Secretary, T. Martin: Have been working on web site, adding past newsletters, info on past

board members, etc. Please look at the web site and make suggestions, corrections and send that info to Tom.

Report from Membership, K. Greig: Extended discussion of logistics and issues around maintaining, communicating, updating membership data. Karen agrees to be Membership Coordinator Assistant to Frank. Beth will look into a database management program that might substitute for the current Excel spreadsheet and get that info to the board. The idea is to keep the database user friendly.

Report on progress toward the Strategic Plan: B. Hickey notes we are following this well, except for getting the Ol' Pioneer in the GCA stores. Still working on refinements of the plan, especially in the areas of awards criteria and scholarship. Amy notes cloud drive location could hold strategic plan. Kathy will look at permissions management for a Google Document Share drive account. Tom will put Strategic Plan objectives on the web site.

Report from the Outings Committee, E. Brennan: Lots of options for outings, scholarship winners should give presentations; outings can be in the Park or in other areas around the Grand Canyon region. Kathy notes Riordan is available for scholarship winner presentations.

Report from the Oral History Project, T. Martin: Still using GRCA releases which allow us to use the material, suggest putting these up on the web as downloadable MP3's. Tom will write an article looking for volunteers for transcriptions for the OP including interesting interviews.

Report from the Editorial Committee/Action on The Bulletin, W. Ranney. Possible change from 6 to 4 bulletins a year. General consensus is to publish The Bulletin quarterly. Karen will notify Bulletin members about going to 4 Bulletins a year. Let Wayne know if you have article ideas for the OP.

<u>Upcoming Board election/nomination of candidates, W. Ranney</u>: Beth will run again, discussed others to approach as possible board candidates. Wayne will outreach to these people.

Setting criteria for the Pioneer and Hall of Fame Awards, W. Ranney: Pioneer award should be for living candidate. Carol notes might be a good idea to have prior winners choose who is next. Nominations are open to any member, but prior winners (three of more) will choose the upcoming winner. Wayne will create an e-mail list of the GCHS Pioneer Award Winners, and will send that to Lee. Add "a living individual" to the Pioneer award. "The Society wants to honor/recognize a living individual who has made a significant contribution to the understanding of and knowledge about the Grand Canyon of the Colorado." The announcement for the Pioneer award will be Nov 15th; any member can submit an individual with a full nomination application. The chairman will appoint three or more past recipients of the award to choose the winner. The board will have to concur with the selection.

Possible involvement in the Grand Canyon Granitica Festival, 2016, T. Martin: one day event here in Flagstaff spring of 2016, Tom will offer to volunteer, and GCHS should be a sponsor. Details could go to Bulletin. Motion to sponsor the 2016 Granitica, Dave motions, Ellen seconds, motion carries.

Possible involvement with the Replica Boat trip, March 2016, D. Mortenson: Dave will be participating in a do-it-yourself river trip with 5 or 6 historic river boats. Dave will have a presentation at the Marble Canyon Lodge the day before the trip launches. Dave will submit articles about this for the OP and Bulletin. This will be offered as an outing, as well as a day hike to Phantom Ranch when the trip passes Phantom.

2016 Annual Picnic location, W. Ranney: The cost to use Shoshone has increased. Moving to a free location is discussed. Others concur that to hold the picnic at the rim has advantages. Consensus is to keep the picnic at Shoshone.

Adopt A Highway – Proposal to adopt a mile on Highway 180: Adopt a highway mile on Highway 64. Requires twice a year clean-up. Consensus is to postpone this decision until after the 2016 Symposium.

Material donations to GCHS – Where to deposit? T. Martin: The question is what to do with queries from the public about where to put their historic Grand Canyon related material. Beth suggests triaging the query to let the individual know both GRCA and Cline are interested. Tom will write a standardized paragraph on what this wording should say and send that to the board for their review.

<u>Update on a possible lecture program sponsored by GCHS</u>, K. Farretta: Kathy is always looking for presentations at the Riordan State Park.

2016 Symposium Planning, L. Albertson: Lee led the initial planning discussion and the Board established the framework for the 2016 Grand Canyon History Symposium. Details are summarized in a separate document, available from Tom Martin upon request. Symposium dates will be Friday November 4 - Sunday November 6, 2016, with just one full day of presentations on Saturday November 5th. Friday there will be a mixer, plus a public history-themed evening program at Shrine of the Ages. Sunday will have outings focused around S. Rim Village with advance signup. Co-chairs of the symposium will be Helen Ranney and Dave Mortenson.

New/Old Business:

Amy motions and Kathy seconds to give three thank you stipends of \$150 each to Diane Cassidy, Karen Greig and Tom Martin for GCHS background work above and beyond normal volunteer duties on bulletin and web. Motion carries.


Escalade Letter: W. Ranney conducts discussion.
