

Concessioner Uniforms at Grand Canyon


Inspired by NPS Fashion Week, here's a pictorial of Grand Canyon concessioner uniforms through the years:

From a 1994 oral interview with **Dorothy Hunt**, Grand Canyon Fred Harvey waitress and bartender from 1946-1968:

Interviewer: What was your uniform like?

Hunt: [A Native American inspired multi-tiered] dress was what I wore in the cocktail lounge... I wore my Indian jewelry with it. But the uniform in the coffee shop was just a white two-piece uniform with a little black tie and a name plate on it. It was long sleeve. No short sleeves, and not knee length either. They were down to calf length. And white shoes.

Interviewer: Very proper.

Hunt: Yes, very proper. If you had an accident and really soiled your uniform, someone would take over your station and you went and changed your uniform to come back and finish your shift.
